Neal, Myrtle Tyler Faithful, Viola Tyler Goings, and Fannie Pettie Watts. Since its inception, The Sorority was the first Greek Letter organization to charter a chapter in Africa (1948) and in the United Arab Emirates (2014), to form adult and youth auxiliary groups, and to be constitutionally bound to a brother fraternity, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc.

FOUR STRANDS FOR YOUTH CURRICULUM: **CULTURAL AWARENESS & SOCIAL SKILLS ENHANCEMENT**

Cultural awareness experiences specific to the local chapter's community that bridge the gap between the school curriculum and the African American reality that Black History is not taught in school.

Demonstrate their awareness of society's expected behavioral norms by practicing their active listening, group dynamics, and conflict resolutions skills when interacting with their peers.

EDUCATIONAL ENRICHMENT

Participate in local activities that strengthen the youths' knowledge in language arts, math, and science by incorporating STEM Education activities and writing contests at the local, regional, and national levels.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

Social Change Agents--local leaders who are social change agents in the community meet with Zeta's future leaders for upfront and personal quality time to learn how leaders lead.

Leadership Practice--Zeta youth research and organize one of their cultural field events.

Parliamentarian Procedures--Zeta youth study parliamentarian procedures with a Registered Parliamentarian and serve as a presiding officer in a real or mock meeting Community Service.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Provide community service opportunities for youth that embrace the national programmatic thrust such as Z-HOPE, Elder Care, and March of Dimes.

Ensure that activities are age-appropriate for each stage of the youths' leadership development, increasing the quality of the involvement as youth progress through their leadership development.

- Explore the world of S.T.E.M.

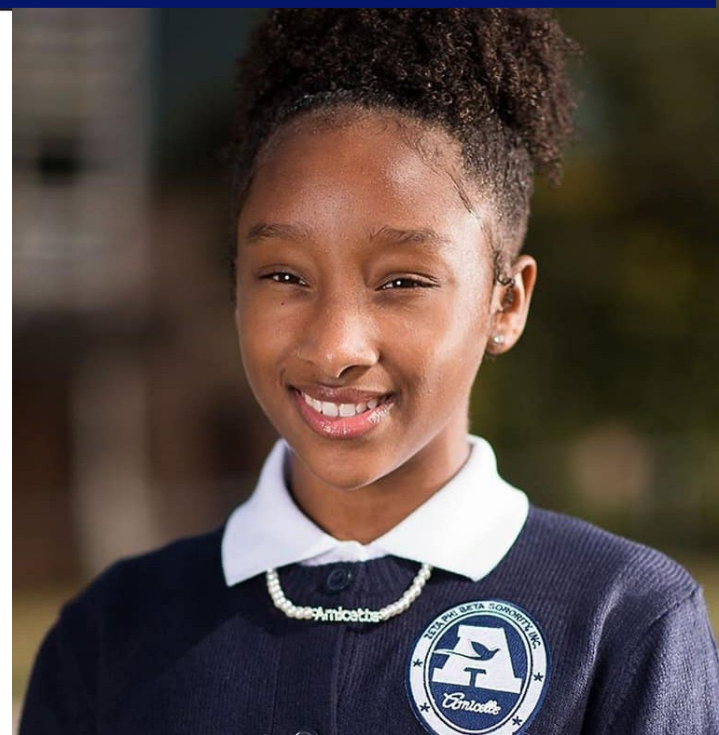


AMICETTE CLUB (9-13 YRS)
